

3. Selected quilts must be mailed to Aullwood by June 17, 2011. All quilts must have a sleeve large enough to accommodate a 1.5" wide batten, sewn near the top on the reverse side for hanging. Please include a self-addressed mailing label and a check for \$15.00 to cover return postage.

4. In the event of a sale, Aullwood will retain a 20% commission.

5. Aullwood will exercise all precautions for the proper handling and safety of your quilt and packaging. Aullwood reserves the right to photograph your quilt for publicity purposes.

6. Aullwood reserves the right to reject any quilt that in Aullwood's opinion differs greatly in appearance from the submitted image.

Exhibit Rules

1. The work must have the basic structure of a quilt. It must be predominantly fiber (to which other materials may be added) and must consist of at least two distinct layers held together by stitches distributed throughout the surface of the work. Quilts may be pieced or appliquéd by hand or machine, or constructed with other techniques. Quilting may be done by hand or machine. The vertical dimension should not exceed 72 inches; the horizontal dimension should not exceed 60 inches.

2. Two images, detail and full view, of each quilt (JPEG images of at least 300 dpi and no larger than 7 inches in any direction or photographic slides) must be submitted by May 23, 2011 with a non-refundable entry fee of \$15.00 – up to 3 quilts per entry fee. Checks should be made out to National Audubon Society. Do not embed your name on any image. You must remain anonymous to the Jurors. JPEG images (on a disk or CD-ROM) or slides should be mailed to:

All quilts must be original works. All artists will be notified by mail no later than June 1 of the jurors' decision. Images of accepted works become the property of Aullwood Audubon Center and Farm and may be used to publicize the exhibit.
